

- Every student should purchase “Medical Parasitology student’s workbook” parts: 1, 2 and 3 (the recent edition of the Medical University of Warsaw), and carry all of them to all Medical Parasitology classes.
The workbooks can be purchased at Warsaw Medical University’s Publishing House (ul. Pawińskiego 3);
- All students should bring laboratory coat to every class;
- Seminar presentations should be saved only in “.pdf” or “.ppt/.pptx” format and provided to the teacher **at least 1 day prior to presentation**. All students in the seminar group have to participate in the presentation preparation and everyone has to present in front of audience. Seminar assignment and presentation agenda will be managed at the first meeting.

Seminars’ topics:

- 1) Toxoplasmosis in pregnancy;
- 2) Malaria – epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 3) Free-Living Amoebae infections;
- 4) Schistosomosis (Bilharziasis)– epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 5) Echinococcosis – epidemiology, symptoms and diagnostics;
- 6) Human filarioses - epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 7) Most common soil transmitted helminths (STH);
- 8) Most common food-borne parasitoses;
- 9) Most common childhood parasitoses;
- 10) Beneficial parasites and possible parasitic therapies;
- 11) Human vaccines for parasitic diseases – current state of art.
