## **Seminar topics:**

- 1) Toxoplasmosis in pregnancy;
- 2) Malaria – epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 3) Free-Living Amoebae infections;
- 4) Schistosomiasis (Bilharziasis)– epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 5) Echinococcosis – epidemiology, symptoms and diagnostics;
- 6) Human filarioses - epidemiology, symptoms and possible prevention;
- 7) Most common soil transmitted helminths (STH);
- 8) Most common food-borne parasitoses;
- 9) Most common childhood parasitoses;
- 10) Beneficial parasites and possible parasitic therapies;
- 11) Human vaccines for parasitic diseases – current state of art.

All students in the seminar group have to participate in the presentation preparation and everyone has to present in front of audience.
